Personal protective equipment (PPE) - Intensive care unit (ICU) specific and infection control, sedation, monitoring- including arterial lines and Central Venous Catheters, Acid -base balance and arterial blood gases, pathophysiology and treatments, acute respiratory distress syndrome, proning, shock, fluids, inotropes and renal replacement therapy (dialysis) .
