



You might be asked to wait for 15 minutes after your injection. The nurse will want to check that you feel ok.



For the vaccine to work properly you will need another injection in 3 to 4 weeks time.



You will be told when you need to come back for your second injection.



Continue to follow all the social distancing rules until told not to do so.



**Having your
Coronavirus Vaccine**



Some people with learning disabilities can get very ill if they get Coronavirus.



There is a new Coronavirus vaccine available. Anyone who needs the vaccine will be invited when it's their turn.



Having the vaccine helps keep you safe from Coronavirus. The vaccine is given by injection into your arm.



It doesn't cost any money.



You don't need to contact your GP or health services. You will get a letter or a text message.



The letter will tell you when and where to go for your injection.



If you are scared of having an injection tell the nurse.



The injection is quick.



It may hurt a little.



After the injection, your arm might be sore for a while.



A few people might have side effects.

These might include feeling a little bit hot, tired or achy.
